CHAPTER 9:50

TRUSTEES ACT

AN ACT applying the United Kingdom Trustee Act 1850 (13 & 14 Vict. c.60) to the State.

[7th December 1877]

1. This Act may be cited as the –

TRUSTEES ACT.

2. So much of the United Kingdom Act of Parliament, thirteen and fourteen Victoria, chapter sixty, entitled, “An Act to consolidate and amend the Laws relating to the Conveyance and Transfer of Real and Personal Property vested in Mortgagees and Trustees,” therein authorised to be cited as “The Trustee Act, 1850,” as extended and amended by the United Kingdom Act of Parliament, fifteen and sixteen Victoria, chapter fifty-five, entitled “An Act to extend the Provisions of the Trustee Act, 1850,” and of the said last-mentioned Act, as is applicable to the state and condition of the State, shall be, and the same is hereby declared to be, henceforth in force in the State in regard to real and personal property within the State.

3. The powers and authorities given by the said Acts to the Court of Chancery in England, in regard to real and personal estate vested in trustees and mortgagees, shall and may be exercised by the High Court in regard to real and personal estate within the State similarly vested.

4. An order made under the authority of this Act shall have the same effect as an order made under the authority of the said Acts of Parliament.

5. Where in the said Acts reference is made to the Act of the United Kingdom Parliament, three and four William the Fourth, chapter seventy-four entitled “An Act for the Abolition of Fines and Recoveries, and the substitution of more simple Modes of Conveyance,” such reference shall, for the purposes of this Act, be construed to mean and apply to any Act for supplying the want of fines and recoveries.

6. Nothing in, or authorised by, this Act shall be deemed to interfere with the operation of the said recited Acts of Parliament or any order, matter or thing hereby authorised.
